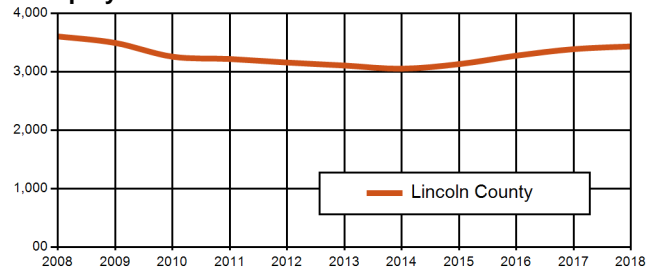

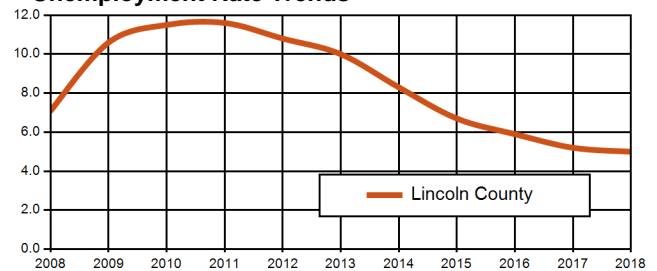

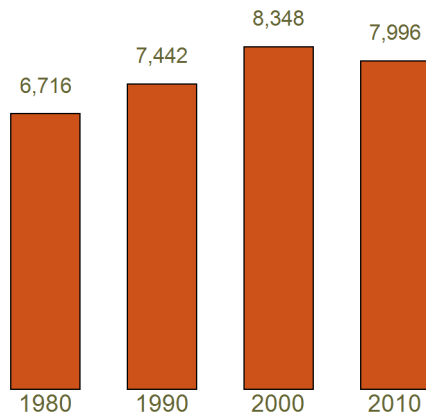

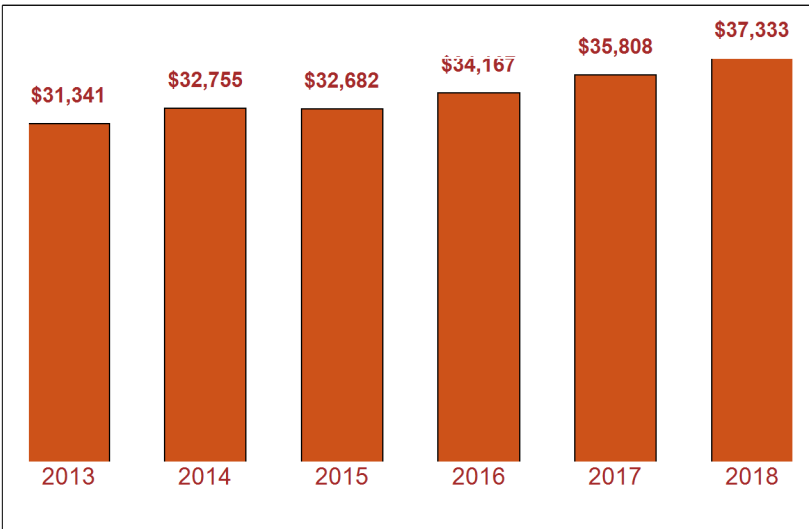

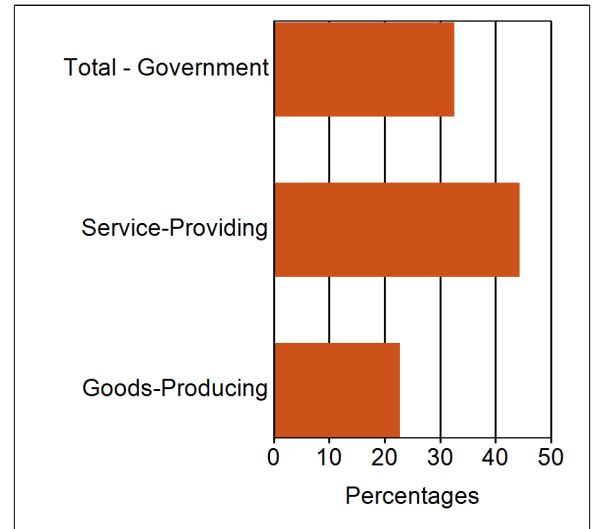
Lincoln Per Capita Income
